

The leader introduces a time of open prayer, perhaps with suggestions for particular topics.

These might include:

- The leaders of the nations
- Our local community
- Our local schools
- The mission of the church in our parish
- Those unwell or bereaved.

A more formal structure is also possible, and leaders are welcome to find their own. An example, taken from the Church of England website, is below.

We pray for those who are in need; for the sick, sorrowful and bereaved. We pray for all who bring comfort, care and healing. We give thanks for human love and friendship and for all that enriches our daily lives.

Let us commend ourselves, and all for whom we pray, to the mercy and protection of God.
