## St Bartholomew's and St Christopher's

St Bartholomew's Church was rebuilt in 1870. The tower, dating from the 13th century, is the oldest part of the church. Within the church are many memorials, including tributes to Alfred Lord Tennyson, Gerard Manley Hopkins & Sir Robert Hunter.





St Christopher's Church was built in 1903 in the Arts & Crafts style with a remarkable unity of design.

Sir John Betjeman, commended it in his 1958 address 'In Praise of St Christopher's Church'.

### Our Heritage

The churches of St Bartholomew and St. Christopher are part of the heritage of the town of Haslemere. They belong to the whole community and are the focal point for weddings, baptisms, funerals and civic occasions.
