


Praying on Sunday

The Prayers

Let us pray with hope and thanksgiving, humbly making our requests to God. In all matter, we ask God to hear us and help us.

Dear Lord, we pray for a time when all nations enjoy spiritual freedom and there is lasting peace on earth. We pray especially for the people in parts of the world where there is conflict, discord or poverty. Help those in their courageous fight for freedom and self-determination.

Let us also pray for Charles our King, as he devotes his life to serving us his people and as head of our church; and we pray for all other members of the Royal family who continue to perform their charitable duties.

Let us continue to pray for the armed forces and intelligence services who keep us safe from aggression, from wherever it may come, to preserve our right to freedom, democracy and the right to worship through many different faiths.

Dear Lord, we continue to pray for all Christians throughout the world who risk their lives in the courageous pursuit of their faith. And we ask that you will accept our gracious thanks that we live in a tolerant, free and open society where all faiths may worship in safety.

We pray for our ministers who work tirelessly to administer the Word, and we thank the Lord for Chris, Justin, Peter, Victoria, Verity and the pastoral team and all who minister to us in this parish.

Dear Lord, we pray all the local businesses, services, pubs and restaurants in this community as they face the challenge of online shopping and increasing costs. We pray and thank the Lord for all the work done by this parish to bring the church and local communities closer together.

We pray for all the people in and around Haslemere who are struggling to make ends meet in these times of a high cost of living. And we hold before God Haslemere Food Bank and all those volunteers and contributors who help and support those in need in our community. We open our hearts to the Lord as he guides us along a path to ever strengthening ties between the churches and the local community.

Lord, hear us

All Lord, graciously hear us.

We pray for all those who are in any kind of need; for those in refugee camps, for the mentally unwell, and those suffering from serious illness and those who grieve for the loss of loved ones or are suffering from natural disasters or extremes of weather, and for those young people suffering from online bullying.

We pray for all the doctors, nurses, counsellors who work tirelessly to comfort and heal those who are sick in body or mind, sometimes in the most impossible circumstances, often in distant countries. We give thanks for their inestimable compassion and human love and dedication to their duty, as we give thanks to God for the social workers and those in local churches who continue to give support and comfort for those suffering from loneliness and vulnerability.

Finally, we pray for all those family, friends, relations, and all those who have brought inspiration and joy into our lives and have now departed from this life. Today we pray especially for those in our parish who have recently departed: **<from the notes sheet>**

Everlasting Lord, we remember with affection and gratitude the lives and example of all those who have gone before us. We pray that you will bring us all to a united worship of you, in your own good time.


The Final Blessing
