The Beason of Easter

In the glorious season of Easter we live not in the shadow of the cross, but in the bright radiance of the resurrection. For forty days the disciples were witness to the fulfilment of God's promises, as Jesus appeared on many occasions and to more than five-hundred people. Never in all of creation, before or since, has such a deed of divine love brought such a transformation in the world.



As we gather in these weeks leading up to Christ's ascension we too can bear witness to all that God has done. In equal faith, therefore let us each lay down our lives at the foot of the cross in confession, and yet be lifted up and restored into the image of the one and only Son. Let us listen to God's word, to offer our prayers in hope, and share in the body and blood of He who is everlasting – Jesus Chris our Lord.

The Gathering

Please stand

We begin our preparation for communion as we come together before God to greet each other, to reflect on our lives, to ask, receive and celebrate God's forgiveness and to pray.

Hymn and Procession

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

The Welcome

Grace, mercy and peace from God our Father And the Lord Jesus Christ be with you

All and also with you.

Prayers of Preparation

Jesus said to his disciples, 'These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you—that everything written about me in the law of Moses, the prophets, and the psalms must be fulfilled. Then he opened their minds to understand the scriptures.'

In Confession

We rejoice in the presence of our risen Lord. Christ our passover lamb has been sacrificed for us. Let us therefore rejoice by putting away all malice and evil and confessing our sins with a sincere and true heart.

We remember Christ's offering of himself for us and his last supper with his disciples, blessing the bread and wine to be for us his body and blood.

The Breaking of the Bread

The president breaks the consecrated bread:

We break this bread to share in the body of Christ.

- All Though we are many, we are one body, because we all share in one bread.
- All Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world, have mercy on us.

The Giving of Communion

All Most merciful Lord, your love compels us to come in.
Our hands were unclean, our hearts were unprepared; we were not fit even to eat the crumbs from under your table. But you, Lord, are the God of our salvation, and share your bread with sinners.
So cleanse and feed us with the precious body and blood of your Son, that he may live in us and we in him; and that we, with the whole company of Christ, may sit and eat in your kingdom. Amen.

Draw near with faith. Receive the body of our Lord Jesus Christ which he gave for you, and his blood which he shed for you. Eat and drink in remembrance that he died for you, and feed on him in your hearts by faith with thanksgiving.

The choir sings an anthem.

Or:

If you are a visitor, and receive communion in a church you usually attend, whether it is in the Church of England or not, please feel welcome to receive communion here today.

If you prefer, you may receive a blessing instead: please bow your head and keep your hands by your sides as you come forward.

The Prayer after Communion

The Post Communion prayer is said by the President.

All God of truth,

we have seen with our eyes and touched with our hands the bread of life: now strengthen our faith that we may grow in love for you and for each other; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

All Amen.


